- 5. ANY OTHER BUSINESS c) TREASURER'S REPORT: The Treasurer confirmed that:
  - i) The raffle at the first day of the Singles Competition had raised £120.00. less the cost of the prizes.
  - ii) Cheques totalling £75.00. had been received from Lodge Sports Hubble & Freeman and Inplay, in respect of relevant advertisements in the new Rule Book.
  - iii) The Bank balance stood at £178.00. and the Building Society at £2,581.00. with outstanding commitments due to the Black Lion for Competitions to date.
  - iv) 100 Lady bowler badges had been purchased and would be on sale at Competitions for £1.00. each.
  - A cheque for £109.00. had been paid to Grain in respect of the hire of their hall and the buffet provided for the County match against Essex. A further £40.00. in Marks & Spencer vouchers had been forwarded to the 8 ladies of Grain Club who prepared the magnificent buffet, as appreciation of the Association's thanks for their hard work.
  - d) A.G.M.: The President proposed that a date and venue be agreed for the A.G.M. Mrs. Wells offered the facilities of the Maidstone Community Support Centre which was accepted by Members present. A tentative date of 17th February, 1991 was agreed on the provision that this would be available. Mrs. Wells to confirm.
  - e) SECRETARY'S REPORT: The Secretary confirmed that:
    - i) She had written to the Mellotones Dance Band who had been booked for the Presentation Dinner Dance and had received a reply, confirming the booking for 27th April, 1991.
    - ii) She had been contacted by Apples Bowls Club from E. Peckham who had requested further information about our Association and who were interested in joining Kent Bowls next season.
  - f) PRESENTATION DINNER DANCE: The President requested that when the booking was made for 1992, if possible, the last week of April be avoided as he would normally be unable to attend at this time. Noted by the Secretary.

    - i) He had been approached by Mr. Hibbert regarding a nearly new mat for sale in East Kent. The Chairman proposed that the Association purchase this mat at £120.00. which was agreed by Members present.
    - ii) Regal Green would now be supplying the mats for the open competition at Pontins and that the Association would be given two mats, free of charge, after this event.

5. ANY OTHER BUSINESS CONTINUED

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT CONTINUED: The Chairman reported that:

- iii) He confirmed that he had written to Pontins Holiday Camp accepting arrangements regarding next year's booking. One or two points were left in abeyance however and as soon as these are cleared, Pontins would proceed to promote this venue. After a query from Mrs. Wells as to accommodation at Pontins in respect of her disabled members, it was stated that non-playing visitors would be accepted by Pontins but people would not be allowed to play in the Competitions unless they were booked in to the Camp. Mrs. Wells confirmed that she would be contacting Pontins personally, to qualify the facilities available in respect of the disabled. It was suggested that, in due course, a list of all Kent County Clubs should be forwarded to Pontins by the Secretary in order that information could be forwarded to them by Pontins.
- iv) The Treasurer, Secretary and Chairman had visited Tricia Ives in Sussex, during November, to discuss the running of the two Associations. Unfortunately, Mr. Mulcuck had been unable to continue with the journey to Sussex when he was taken ill en route and had to return home. Tricia Ives had since written a letter to the Chairman thanking him and the Rycrafts for their visit.
